Girls Group empowers young women to achieve emotional and economic self-sufficiency by ensuring they graduate from high school and begin their college or career journeys.

- Programming spans middle school, high school, and continues through college and careers.
- Participants are mentored by experienced staff and interns.
- Year-round comprehensive programming focuses on academic readiness, social/emotional life skills, financial education, and community service.

BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE

Weekly program for young women in middle and high school including youth-led activities, safe space to explore identities, and focus on positive relationships with peers and mentors. Services include individual mentoring, in-school and after-school group sessions. Focuses are:

- Study skills
- Budgeting

- Healthy relationships
- Asking for help

- Being a lifelong learner
- Saving money
- Self care

Community service

The pipeline of Girls Group programming feeds from one core program (Building for the Future) into the other programs. Participants in middle school and high school start in the Building for the Future program. From there, they can access Summer Enrichment programming and College & Career Prep programming. When Building for the Future participants graduate from high school, they enter the Women of Purpose program.

PROGRAM SCOPE

Girls Group offers weekly in-school and after school programs at 20 sites in the Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti area:

In-school programs for 6th-8th grade girls take place at 5 middle schools.

Weekly after-school programs for 9th-12th grade girls take place at 4 high schools.

Girls Group also holds a weekly Wrap Around program in the community that is open to 9th-12th grade students.

BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE PARTICIPANTS

Girls Group participants tend to be intelligent, enthusiastic, and goal-oriented. Participants are referred to Girls Group by teachers, counselors, principals, community members, family members and girls who are already in the group. Our Building for the Future program serves 300 middle school and 150 high school students in Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti.
