MISSION

Girls Group empowers young women to achieve emotional and economic self-sufficiency by ensuring they graduate from high school and begin their college or career journeys.

- Programming spans middle school, high school, and continues through college and careers.
- Participants are mentored by experienced staff and interns.
- Year-round comprehensive programming focuses on academic readiness, social/emotional life skills, financial education, and community service.



WHAT WE DO ______ Four core programs

Building for the Future

Twenty weekly group programs for middle school and high school students. Youth led activities, safe space to explore identities, and focus on positive relationships with peers and mentors.

Summer Enrichment

Eight weeks of college and career exploration summer camps, weekly discussion groups, activities, and field trips designed to get participants out into their communities and away from the dangers of summer learning loss.

College & Career Prep

Post-secondary planning support through one-on-one mentoring and workshops to promote college and career readiness. Services support planning for the future.

Women of Purpose

One-on-one mentoring and peer support for young women on their college and career journeys. Services promote giving back and further skill development to support self-sufficiency.

FOUR PROGRAM THEMES

Girls Group uses a strengths-based approach to college and career readiness, focusing on 4 primary themes:

Academic Readiness

Meeting academic requirements to graduate high school and possessing the skills to succeed in college

Social-Emotional Readiness

The belief in your capacity to overcome obstacles and pursue dreams

§ Financial Readiness

The belief in one's capacity to achieve financial stability and a financial plan to support those goals

Community Service

Recognizing your greatness through service to others



WHO WE SERVE

In 2021, Girls Group served 690 participants from middle school girls all the way through young women on their college and career journeys.

Our College and Career Prep program served 50 high school seniors in Washtenaw County. Our Women of Purpose program served 240 young women on their college and career journeys. 46 of these young women already graduated from a four-year university, obtained an associate's degree, or earned a professional certification.

Girls Group helps participants to build confidence and resilience. Participants are referred to Girls Group by teachers, counselors, principals, community members, family members, or girls who are already in the group. Many of our participants say that they initially come to the programs for the free pizza, but stay for the sisterhood they develop. Girls Group values the determination of the young women we serve. We believe that through educational and financial empowerment, Girls Group participants can show the world that even the most disadvantaged students, when given encouragment and support to succeed, can defy the odds and realize their dreams.

HOW WE SERVE

Girls Group provides year-round comprehensive group and individual mentoring programs in schools and the community. The mentoring relationship helps young women discover who they are, cultivate abilities to shape their own lives, and learn how to engage with and contribute to the world around them. Girls Group's effectiveness is, in large part, due to long-term and supportive relationships, which often begin in middle school, and carry through into high school and college.

All programs are planned, developed, and implemented by highly-trained, talented, and compassionate Girls Group Mentors. These mentors are either staff or social work interns. We believe that every mentor, participant, and family member helps to shape our legacy for current and future generations. We are proud that older Girls Group participants gratefully mentor younger Girls Group participants.
